The logo is a tree that has been shaped in the form of a globe. It bears in its imagery all the components of our ______ and _____. The Bible uses the imagery of grapes and vines. In the same way, Jesus would be the roots of the tree. If there are no roots, then the tree will die. So, as we are driven to share the Gospel, we prayerfully hope these prospects will come to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. If they have indeed received Jesus as Lord and Savior, then we joyfully disciple them to be united to the body and Christ. This new believer then begins to grow and as they continue to obey the Lord, the more their passions will match His passions because Christ is the center of their life. As this growing believer grows, they will then obey and start being Gospel driven in order to bring more and more people to Jesus. The more the Gospel is proclaimed, the more excited the total body of Christ becomes and the more joyfully united we become. The more united we are, the more we understand God did not call us to keep the Gospel to ourselves and our community only, but rather to take the Gospel to the world. So, because Christ is the center of our being and we are Gospel driven by His passions, we joyfully become united to share this hope with the world and we prayerfully seek His guidance and join Him where He is already at work. We call this joining Him in this work obedience and the longer we do this, the bigger and healthier our global tree becomes.

SECTION #2

CHRIST CENTERED

Christ centeredness is an all encompassing subject in regards to who Jesus is, what He is like, and what He did. The following is a very brief overview of this very broad subject.

1. Christ is a title given to _____ and it points to His Messianic role as Prophet, Priest and King.

When we speak of Jesus as the Prophet, Priest and King, we need to understand He did not hold these offices in an earthly capacity. As such, we ought to look at the function of His work, as Millard Erickson suggests in his systematic theology work *Christian Theology*, as that of Revealing, Reconciling and Ruling.

A. ______ - Revealing

In Moses' final address to the children of Israel he said, "The Lord your God will raise up for you a *prophet* like me from among you, from your countrymen, you shall listen to him. This is according to all that you asked of the Lord your God in Horeb on the day of the assembly, saying, 'Let me not hear again the voice of the Lord my God, let me not see this great fire anymore, or I will die.' The Lord said to me, 'They have spoken well. I will raise up a *prophet* from among their countrymen like you, and I will put My words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him (Deuteronomy 18:15-18, *italics added*).'"

Peter shows Jesus' fulfillment of this role when he said, "Moses said, 'The Lord God will raise up for you a *prophet* like me from your brethren; to Him you shall give heed to everything He says to you. And it will be that every soul that does not heed that *prophet* shall be utterly destroyed from among the people (Acts 3:22-23, *italics added*)."

B. _____ - Reconciling

As indicated with the Prophet title and will be shown with the King title, there were Old Testament prophecies regarding the Messiah holding these titles. When it comes to the Priestly title, no prophetic words are given, but the New Testament provides its own explanation. In Jewish tradition, a priest could only come from the Levitical line and the king could only come from the line of Judah. These two different blood lines did not cross in order to produce Jesus. So, how could Jesus be of a Priestly line?

The book of Hebrews gives this answer when stating, "where Jesus has entered as a forerunner for us, having become a *high priest* forever according to the order of Melchizedek (Hebrews 6:20, *italics mine*)." What one learns in the next chapter of Hebrews is that the lesser individual pays tithes to the greater individual and Abraham paid a tithe to Melchizedek while Levi was still in his great grandfather's loins. By doing this, Melchizedek's priesthood is a greater priesthood than that of Aaron and Jesus is a Priest of Melchizedek's order.

C. _____ - Ruling

Psalm 45:6-7 reads, "Your throne, O God, is forever and ever; A scepter of uprightness is the scepter of Your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; Therefore God, Your God, has anointed You With the oil of joy above Your fellows." This psalm from the choir director was pointing to the divine kingship of Jesus when he wrote "Therefore God [Jesus], Your God [God the Father], has anointed You [Jesus] with the oil of joy above Your [Jesus'] fellows."

The book of Revelation reveals the eternal title given to Jesus as King when it reads, "These will wage war against the Lamb, and the Lamb will overcome them, because He is Lord of lords and King of kings, and those who are with Him *are the* called and chosen and faithful (Revelation 17:14)."

2. As Messiah or Christ, Jesus is declaring He is _____.

To preface this section, one must understand Jesus is not God the Father nor is He God the Holy Spirit, but He is God the Son. The following, however, is to give some clarifying thoughts regarding these three aspects of God's character. One calls this totality of God's character the Trinity of God. God is One, but He reveals His perfect nature or character in three unique persons. As a result, God is referred to as the Triune God (three in one).

A. God the _____

Jesus' favorite designation of God was Abba, which means daddy. Mark 14:36 illustrates this point, "And He was saying, 'Abba! Father! All things are possible for You; remove this cup from Me; yet not what I will, but what You will.'" Jesus obviously had the right to call God Abba, but do Christ followers have that same permission? Paul would say, yes, "so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. Because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' Therefore you are no longer a slave, but a son; and if a son, then an heir through God (Galatians 4:5-7)."

As our Father, God displays His characteristics of love, mercy, forgiveness, joy, holiness, purity, jealousy and many other traits.

B. God the _____

God speaking of Jesus said at His baptism, "'This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased' (Matthew 3:17)." Even later in Jesus' ministry God said, "'This is My beloved Son, listen to Him!' (Mark 9:7)."

It is in understanding Jesus that we have a fuller understanding of God. In Colossians 1:15-20 the Bible states, "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, *both* in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. He is also head of the body, the church; and He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that He Himself will come to have first place in everything. For it was the *Father's* good pleasure for all the fullness to dwell in Him, and through Him to reconcile all things to Himself, having made peace through the blood of His cross; through Him, *I say*, whether things on earth or things in heaven."

C. God the _____

Jesus spoke of the Holy Spirit as the One who would come after Him and it would be to the church's advantage for the Holy Spirit to come (John 16:7). Jesus limited Himself in His incarnation to a singular location, but God the Holy Spirit is omnipresent, which means everywhere. As such, the Holy Spirit can indwell all Christ followers at the exact same time.

The Holy Spirit's job was also clarified by Jesus in the very next few verses when He said, "And He, when He comes, will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment; concerning sin, because they do not believe in Me; and concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you no longer see Me; and concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world has been judged (John 16:8-11)."

- **3.** Christ's ______ is complex. For example, He is . . .
 - A. _____

Timothy George wrote about God's infinite character this way, "One of the most important things the Bible says about God is that there is much about him that we do not know, and will never be able to know, for God is infinite; and we are not (and never will be). God dwells in 'unapproachable light' (1 Timothy 6:16); his greatness 'no one can fathom' (Psalm 145:3 NIV); his knowledge is too wonderful for us, too lofty for us to attain (Psalm 139:6 NIV). 'To whom, then, will you compare God?' (Isaiah 40:18 NIV) What image will you compare him to? Isaiah asks. The answer is: to no one and no thing, for God is incomparably great, absolutely sovereign over, and radically other than, everything that exists outside of himself. This means that God is irreducible to the world's categories. He is explicable only in himself; his judgments are unsearchable and his paths beyond tracing out (Romans 11:33 NIV)."

В.____

The historical encounter with God which might best display God's holiness is His encounter with Moses at the burning bush. God informs Moses that the ground on which he is standing is holy ground (Exodus 3:5).

We again return to Timothy George to read his comments regarding this encounter of Moses with God. He wrote, "At God's command, Moses removed his shoes and also hid his face, for he was afraid. Moses had entered a realm of high voltage, and this tells us something important about the nature of God who is about to reveal his personal name. He is not a God to be trifled with, nor approached in a casual, flippant manner, nor sidled up to as one might fraternize with a chum at a football game. For this God is holy, and holiness demands a response of reverence, awe, and reverential wonder."

C. _____

Patrick D. Miller helps us to understand God's mercy as he explains God's wrath and judgment serve a larger purpose, "[which is] the establishment of God's justice, and the renewing and reshaping of his people in the way of holiness. God is 'slow to anger.' God is not to be trifled with, for his judgment is real. But so is his compassion and mercy. He is a God who abounds in steadfast love, as he himself reminded his reluctant Prophet Jonah (Jonah 4:2). Jeremiah, too, knew this message: 'Return, faithless Israel, says the LORD. I will not look on you in anger, for I am merciful, says the LORD; I will not be angry forever' (Jeremiah 3:12 NRSV)."

- **4.** Christ's _____ consisted of three primary aspects.
 - A. Birth and _____

Jesus was born of the virgin Mary and conceived by the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1:18). Jesus grew in wisdom and stature as He matured (Luke 2:52). Jesus lived among humanity and taught them how to have a relationship with God (John 3:16-21).

B. _____ and Burial

Jesus really did die and the process leading up to His death was a complete contradiction to everything He claimed about Himself. Millard J. Erickson wrote, "His status as *prophet* was challenged during his appearance before the high priest: 'Prophesy to us, Christ. Who hit you?' (Matthew 26:68 BSB). His *kingship* and rule were mocked by the inscription put on the cross ('The King of the Jews') and by the taunts of the soldiers ('If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself' (Luke 23:37 NIV). His *priestly* role was called into question by the scoffing remarks of the rulers: 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One' (Luke 23:35 BSB)." Jesus' burial proved His death as He was put in Joseph of Arimathea's tomb (John 19:38-41).

C. Resurrection and _____

Jesus' resurrection proved His victory over sin, death and evil (Colossians 2:15 and 1 John 3:8).

At Jesus' ascension He declared He had all authority and that He would always be with His disciples (Matthew 28:18-20).

Jesus now dwells in glory seated at the right hand of God (Hebrews 10:11-13).

SECTION #3

GOSPEL DRIVEN

Gospel driven points to the passion and purpose of the local church. The book of Acts gives us the biblical breakdown for our commission. Before we can understand this mandate, we need to understand what the Gospel is.

OUR SALVATION

"For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus (Galatians 3:26-28)."

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A CHRISTIAN?

Most people live their entire lives without ever knowing "WHY". They exist year after year with no idea of why they live or God's purpose for their lives. The most basic question a person can ask is "What is the meaning of my life?"

Everyone wants to be happy. People try many ways:

- → Some look for happiness by **acquiring possessions.**
- → Some look for happiness by **experiencing pleasure.**
- → Some look for happiness by **gaining prestige and power.**

But real happiness comes from understanding my

- 1. God made me to _____ me.

WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

Man has a natural desire to _____ and to ignore God's principles for living.

Attitudes we have learned are to look out for your own interests, thinking it's our life so we can do what we want, if it feels good do it, just be happy, and you only live once.

THE BIBLE CALLS THIS ATTITUDE _____

- "All of us like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way...
 (Isaiah 53:6)"
- "If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and the truth is not in us (1 John 1:8)."

Sin breaks our close relationship with God. It causes us to fear God and try to live our lives outside His will.

When our relationship to God is not right, it causes PROBLEMS in every area of our lives - marriage, career, relationships, finances, etc.

There is a way which seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death (Proverbs 16:25)."

Even when we know that our deepest need is God, we often try wrong ways of getting to know Him. For example:

- "My mother was a Christian, so..."
- "I'll give up all my bad habits."
- "I'll work real hard and earn it."
- "I'll be religious and go to church."
- "It doesn't matter what you believe, just be sincere."
- "I'm a good person and I do good things."
- "...for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God... (Romans 3:23)"

WHAT'S THE SOLUTION?

"Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me' (John 14:6)."

God Himself came to earth as a human being to bring us back to Himself. If any other way would have worked, _____ would not have had to come. The Way is a Person!

Jesus has already taken care of your _____ problem!

- "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 6:23)."
- "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)"

God did this for us because He _____ us and wants us to _____ Him.

 "For there is one God, and one mediator also between God and men, the man Christ Jesus... (1 Timothy 2:5)"

God has already done His part to restore our relationship to Him. He took the initiative. Now He waits for each of us to individually accept what He has done for us.

 - "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God (John 1:12-13)."
 - "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me (Revelation 3:20)."

Our relationship to God is not restored by anything we do, but by what Jesus already did for us!

YOU CAN TAKE THESE STEPS BY PRAYING A SIMPLE, BUT SINCERE, PRAYER OF COMMITMENT TO GOD.

Here is an example:

SECTION #4

JOYFULLY UNITED

1. WORSHIP

Worship is not a big word, but it encompasses a lot of different aspects of our Christian lives. All things done for God's glory is an act of worship. WHO SHOULD BE BAPTIZED?

CAN INFANTS AND LITTLE CHILDREN BE BAPTIZED?

At FBCBG, we allow anyone who is born-again to be baptized and sometimes that is a young child.

Some churches practice a "baptism of confirmation" for infants. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on the behalf of the child. The parents commit to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his or her own personal confession of Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed.

This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible, which was only for those who believe. The purpose is to publicly confess your personal commitment to Christ. As a result, we do not baptize infants, or very little children but we do have baby / child dedication services.

At First Baptist it is a membership requirement that every member must have been baptized the way Jesus demonstrated.

WHEN SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

AS ______ AS YOU HAVE ______!

- "So then, those who had received his word were baptized... (Acts 2:41)"
- "Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning from this Scripture he preached Jesus to him. As they went along the road they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look! Water! What prevents me from being baptized?' [And Philip said, 'If you believe with all your heart, you may.' And he answered and said, 'I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God'] (Acts 8:35-38)."

There is no reason to delay. As soon as you have received Christ into your life, you can and should be baptized. If you wait until you are "perfect", you'll never feel "good enough"!

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR WHEN I AM BAPTIZED?

All those being baptized will be given a robe to wear. It would be a good idea to wear a light colored T-shirt and a pair of shorts under your baptismal robe (the robes may be a little transparent after they become wet). We provide towels, hair dryers and changing rooms. Our Baptismal Team assists all those who wish to be baptized in the baptismal room at the time scheduled for your baptism. This assistance includes what to do before, during, and after you are baptized.

*** THE LORD'S SUPPER**

<u>Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth.</u> He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called "ordinances") as reminders of His death. The two ordinances are: **Baptism** and **The Lord's Supper**. The Lord's Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

How To Improve Your Hearing:

- ➡ Be ready and eager to hear God.
 - + (Jesus said) "He who has ears to hear, let him hear! (Luke 8:8)"
 - ◆ "...But everyone must be quick to hear... (James 1:19)"
- ➡ Deal with attitudes that prevent hearing God.
 - ◆ "So take care how you listen... (Luke 8:18)"

Parable of the Sower - (Luke 8:4-15)

- ➡ Confess any sin in your life.
 - "Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls (James 1:21)."

- ➡ Take notes on what you hear.
 - "For this reason we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it (Hebrews 2:1)."
- Act on what you hear!

Barriers to Hearing:

- A Superficial Mind: Am I really serious about wanting to hear God speak?
- * **A Pre-occupied Mind:** Am I too busy and concerned with other things to concentrate on what God has to say?

Keep a Spiritual Journal - A Spiritual Journal is a tool to help you organize and retain the blessings of God and the things you have learned.

II. HOW TO READ GOD'S WORD:

- "Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy, and heed the things which are written in it; for the time is near (Revelation 1:3)."

You should read God's Word daily.

Suggestions:

- \checkmark Read it systematically.
- \checkmark Read it in a Bible without notes.
- ✓ Read it in different translations.

For reading: Good News, Living Bible, Phillips.

- ✓ Read it aloud quietly to yourself.
- ✓ Underline or color code key verses.
- ✓ Choose a reading plan and stick with it.

If you read approximately 20 minutes a day, you can read through the Bible once in a year.

BENEFITS OF MEMORIZING SCRIPTURE:

- → It strengthens me when I'm under stress.
 - "Remember the word to Your servant, in which You have made me hope. This is my comfort in my affliction, that Your word has revived me (Psalm 119:49-50)."
- → It helps me make wise decisions.
 - "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path (Psalm 119:105)."
- ➡ It comforts me when I'm sad.
 - "And Your words became for me a joy and the delight of my heart; For I have been called by Your name, O LORD God of hosts (Jeremiah 15:16)."





MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

At First Baptist, we have many opportunities for you to serve and be a part of the Body of Christ.

But, before we get into these opportunities, it is important that we all understand that every believer is "called" not just pastors and missionaries.

WHO IS CALLED TO SERVE

Rick Warren's Devotional, "*We Serve God by Serving Others*" explains being "called" to serve this way:

- "The Bible says everyone is called to serve God by serving others.
- 'You, my brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love (Galatians 5:13).'
- We are not saved **by** serving, but we are saved **for** serving.
- The Apostle Paul gives three insights related to this:

1. The basis for serving others is salvation. Paul says, 'You were called to be free.'

- You cannot serve God until you've been set free by Jesus. It's the prerequisite for serving. Until you experience the transforming power of God's grace in your life, you're too enslaved by your own hurts, habits, and hang-ups to think much about others.
- Without the freedom of forgiveness, you'll end up serving for the wrong reasons: trying to earn the approval of others, trying to run away from your pain, trying to remedy your guilt, trying to impress God. Service motivated by these illegitimate reasons is bound to leave you burned out and bitter in the end.

2. The barrier to serving others is selfishness. Paul warns, 'Do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature.'

- The number one reason we don't have the time or energy to serve others is that we're preoccupied with our own agendas, dreams, and pleasures.
- Only a small minority of people use their lives to serve others, but Jesus said, 'If you insist on saving your life, you will lose it. Only those who throw away their lives for my sake and for the sake of the Good News will ever know what it means to really live (Mark 8:35 LB).'

3. The motive for serving is love. Paul says, 'Serve one another in love.'

- This is an important key to building community: 1 Corinthians 13:3 MSG records, 'No matter what I say, what I believe, and what I do, I'm bankrupt without love.'
- God is far more interested in <u>why</u> you serve others than in how well you serve them. He's always looking at your heart, serving willingly and eagerly out of love for Jesus and gratitude for all He's done for you.
- You are most like Jesus when you're serving others. After washing his disciples' feet, Jesus said, 'I have given you an example to follow. Do as I have done to you' (John 13:14-15 NLT)."

WAYS TO SERVE AT FIRST BAPTIST

(Wednesday Evenings from 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm)

Objective: To teach children from age 3 through 3rd grade about the love of Jesus and how to have a relationship with Him through Bible stories, crafts and activities in a safe and thriving environment for spiritual growth.

B.O.L.D.

(Wednesday Evenings from 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm)

Objective: To teach children from 4th grade - 6th grade about the love of Jesus and how to have a relationship with Him through Bible stories, crafts and activities in a safe and thriving environment for spiritual growth.

YOUTH

(Sunday Mornings from 9:30 am - 10:30 am, Sunday Evenings from 6:00 pm -7:00 pm, Wednesday Evenings from 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm) Objective: To teach youth from 7th - 12th grade about the love of Jesus and how to have a growing relationship with Him through Bible study and activities in a safe and thriving environment for spiritual growth.

ADULT SMALL GROUP LEADERS

(Sunday Mornings from 9:30 am - 10:30 am) Objective: To lead and teach adults through Bible study and discussion (class settings of different age groups).

GREETER MINISTRY

(Sunday Mornings from 9:15 am - 9:30 am and 10:30 am - 10:45 am) Objective: To welcome guests and members at all church entrances prior to morning worship services with a smile and greetings, and to offer assistance if needed.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

Objective: Oversee all internationally related ministries of FBCBG.


NOMINATING COMMITTEE

DISCOVER YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS!

GENE WILKES

Ken Hemphill defines a spiritual gift as "an individual manifestation of grace from the Father that enables you to serve Him and thus play a vital role in His plan for the redemption of the world." Peter Wagner defines a spiritual gift as "a special attribute given by the Holy Spirit to every member of the Body of Christ according to God's grace for use within the context of the Body." I like to use this definition: A spiritual gift is an expression of the Holy Spirit in the life of believers which empowers them to serve the body of Christ, the church.

Romans 12:6-8; 1 Corinthians 12:8-10, 28-30; Ephesians 4:11; and 1 Peter 4:9-11 contain representative lists of gifts and roles God has given to the church. A definition of these gifts follows.

Leadership - Leadership aids the body by leading and directing members to accomplish the goals and purposes of the church. Leadership motivates people to work together in unity toward common goals (Romans 12:8).

Administration - Persons with the gift of administration lead the body by steering others to remain on task. Administration enables the body to organize according to God-given purposes and long-term goals (1 Corinthians 12:28).

Teaching - Teaching is instructing members in the truths and doctrines of God's Word for the purposes of building up, unifying, and maturing the body (1 Corinthians 12:28; Romans 12:7; Ephesians 4:11).

Knowledge - The gift of knowledge manifests itself in teaching and training in discipleship. It is the God-given ability to learn, know, and explain the precious truths of God's Word. A word of knowledge is a Spirit-revealed truth (1 Corinthians 12:28).

Wisdom - Wisdom is the gift that discerns the work of the Holy Spirit in the body and applies His teachings and actions to the needs of the body (1 Corinthians 12:28).

Prophecy - The gift of prophecy is proclaiming the Word of God boldly. This builds up the body and leads to conviction of sin. Prophecy manifests itself in preaching and teaching (1 Corinthians 12:10; Romans 12:6).

Discernment - Discernment aids the body by recognizing the true intentions of those within or related to the body. Discernment tests the message and actions of others for the protection and well-being of the body (1 Corinthians 12:10).

Exhortation - Possessors of this gift encourage members to be involved in and enthusiastic about the work of the Lord. Members with this gift are good counselors and motivate others to service. Exhortation exhibits itself in preaching, teaching, and ministry (Romans 12:8).

Shepherding - The gift of shepherding is manifested in persons who look out for the spiritual welfare of others. Although pastors, like shepherds, do care for members of the church, this gift is not limited to a pastor or staff member (Ephesians 4:11).

Faith - Faith trusts God to work beyond the human capabilities of the people. Believers with this gift encourage others to trust in God in the face of apparently insurmountable odds (1 Corinthians 12:9).

Evangelism - God gifts his church with evangelists to lead others to Christ effectively and enthusiastically. This gift builds up the body by adding new members to its fellowship (Ephesians 4:11).

Apostleship - The church sends apostles from the body to plant churches or be missionaries. Apostles motivate the body to look beyond its walls in order to carry out the Great Commission (1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11).

Service/Helps - Those with the gift of service/helps recognize practical needs in the body and joyfully give assistance to meeting those needs. Christians with this gift do not mind working behind the scenes (1 Corinthians 12:28; Romans 12:7).

Mercy - Cheerful acts of compassion characterize those with the gift of mercy. Persons with this gift aid the body by empathizing with hurting members. They keep the body healthy and unified by keeping others aware of the needs within the church (Romans 12:8).

Giving - Members with the gift of giving give freely and joyfully to the work and mission of the body. Cheerfulness and liberality are characteristics of individuals with this gift (Romans 12:8).

Hospitality - Those with this gift have the ability to make visitors, guests, and strangers feel at ease. They often use their home to entertain guests. Persons with this gift integrate new members into the body (1 Peter 4:9).

God has gifted you with an expression of His Holy Spirit to support His vision and mission of the church. It is a worldwide vision to reach all people with the gospel of Christ. As a servant leader, God desires that you know how He has gifted you. This will lead you to where He would have you serve as part of His vision and mission for the church.


